"Another great Soundscape from the Unquiet Void. These albums are ambient with just a touch of music at times, haunting and darkly beautiful. This cd is one of a trilogy (now a quartet) dedicated to H.P.Lovecrafts creations. This one recounts the Outer Gods of Lovecrafts Stories centered around Azathoth, Yog Sothoh and a touch of Nyarlathotep. For those as obsessed with Lovecraft as I am, you will recall that Azathoth resides at the center of chaos with other outer gods circling him playing what may be flutes in a mad dance. The track "Idiot God", a reference to Azathoth, is mostly a sound-scape with atmospheric noises that rage, lull and then rage again for a while; then out of the distance one can hear a three note melody played for a instance, then another. It is one of the most haunting and accurate to the text moments on this excellent cd. I hope the Unquiet Void explores other dark realms in the future. Check this out if you like Dark ambient music like Skinny Puppy, Nox Arcana and Midnight Syndicate."
