"I was particularly looking forward to hearing "Vanished Aeons", as "At the Mountains of Madness" is one of my favorite HP Lovecraft tales. I am a recently retired Professor of Archaeology/Anthropology at the University of California, Riverside, and my research has focused on the ancient Maya of Central America and southeast Mexico. I've done over 30 years of survey fieldwork, and have found and mapped numerous ancient Mayan cities that were previously unreported. The sense of awe I always feel when entering and exploring ruins is reflected in Lovecraft's story and {The Unquiet Void's} "soundscapes", as I refer to them. I'm still doing fieldwork, so next time I'm exploring a new ruin, I'll bring my IPod with "Vanished Aeons" to play as a soundtrack!"
